Source of revenue increase:

The Wyoming Board of Medicine (BOM) would institute new licensing fees for anesthesiologist assistants upon initial application and for annual renewal of licenses, generating additional revenue.

Assumptions:

The BOM assumes the initial fees would be set at the same level as physician assistant licensing fees: \$250 for an initial license and \$90 for an annual renewal. As to the expected quantity of new licensees, the BOM estimates approximately a dozen (12) initial license applications in the first fiscal year, dropping by about a third (to eight (8) initial applications) in each subsequent fiscal year. The BOM estimates approximately 90% of licensees would renew their licenses annually.

The BOM notes that there will be an initial administrative impact to implement this bill. For the three years analyzed in this fiscal note the BOM expects the costs to administer these new licenses to be higher than the estimated revenues generated. Other BOM licensing revenue will likely be required to cover the full cost of the bill's implementation under the current assumptions.

NOTICE-AGENCY ESTIMATE OF ADMINISTRATIVE IMPACT REQUESTED

This bill has <u>administrative impact</u> that appears to increase duties or responsibilities of one or more state agencies and may impact agency spending or staffing requirements. As introduced, the bill does not modify any state agency budget or current personnel authorizations.
