Source of revenue increase:

Increase in nonresident special hunting license application fees for elk, deer and antelope

Assumptions:

Assuming the number of nonresident special hunting licenses issued for elk, deer and antelope are consistent with the three-year averages for calendar year 2020 through 2022, a total revenue increase of \$5,731,000 per year is anticipated.

The calendar year 2020 through 2022 average number of nonresident special hunting licenses issued were as follows:

- Nonresident special elk - 2,639
- Nonresident special deer - 3,831
- Nonresident special antelope - 3,192

This bill is effective January 1, 2024. Therefore, the revenue increase anticipated in FY 2024 reflects the amount associated with elk only.
