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state, tribal and federal law enforcement agencies to 6 7 employ the integrated public alert and warning system or 8 successor system to notify residents of imminent threat by natural disaster or manmade event or to aid in the safe 9 10 recovery of missing or endangered persons, which adheres to 11 United States department of justice criteria. The director shall also assist local, state, tribal and federal law 12 13 enforcement agencies integrate into existing alert systems 14 additional missing persons alert communications networks 15 that enable and help facilitate search efforts for an adult 16 at risk or other missing person of an age, needs or 17 circumstances that may fall outside the scope of the 18 integrated public alert and warning system or successor 19 system. As used in this paragraph "adult at risk" means an 20 adult who has a developmental disability, who suffers from 21 Alzheimer's disease or dementia, or who suffers from or 22 could, without access to medication, suffer from cognitive impairment if the impairment would likely render the adult 23

The state highway patrol shall operate and 13 integrate with existing alert systems additional missing 14 15 persons alert communications networks that enable and help 16 facilitate search efforts for an adult at risk or other 17 missing person of an age, needs or circumstances that may fall outside the scope of the integrated public alert and 18 19 warning system or successor system. The state highway 20 patrol shall report annually to the division of criminal investigation the number of times and dates that the alert 21 22 system was systems were used, the age, race and gender of the abducted person, whether the abduction was thwarted and 23
