(b) This section shall not be interpreted to prohibit 8 any lawful proceeding that compels a person to produce, 9 10 sell, transfer, convey or disclose a digital asset, digital 11 identity or other interest or right to which a private key 12 provides access, or to disclose information about the 13 digital asset, digital identity or other interest or right, provided that the person is not required to produce or 14 disclose the private key except as otherwise required by 15 16 subsection (a) of this section.

1 2 (v) "Private key" means a unique element of 3 cryptographic data, or any substantially similar analogue, 4 which is: 5 6 (A) Held by a person; 7 8 (B) Paired with a unique, publicly 9 available element of cryptographic data; and 10 11 (C) Associated with an algorithm that is necessary to carry out an encryption or decryption required 12 13 to execute a transaction. 14 15 Section 3.
