A BILL

for

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7 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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9 **Section 1**. W.S. 16-6-1101 is created to read:

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- 11 ARTICLE 11
- 12 CONTRACTOR LICENSES RECIPROCITY

- 14 16-6-1101. Contractor licenses; reciprocity;
- 15 requirements.

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1 2 (a) As used in this section: 3 (i) "Accepting jurisdiction" means a county, 4 city, town or other government entity that is required to 5 6 recognize and accept a license issued by an 7 jurisdiction; 8 9 (ii) "Contractor" means a person employed by and 10 contracting with an owner to improve an owner's property; 11 (iii) "Issuing jurisdiction" means the county, 12 city, town or other government entity that issued a license 13 14 to a contractor; 15 16 (iv) "License" means any license or 17 certification necessary for a contractor to perform work in a jurisdiction. 18 19 20 (b) Each county, city, town and other government 21 entity that issues licenses to contractors shall recognize

a license issued to a contractor by another county, city,

1	town	or	other	government	entity	in	Wyoming,	in	accord	lance
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2 with the following:

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4 (i) Before the accepting jurisdiction shall

5 recognize the license under this section:

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7 (A) The contractor's license shall be

8 active; and

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10 (B) The contractor shall be in good

11 standing with the issuing jurisdiction and shall provide to

12 the accepting jurisdiction any proof of financial assurance

13 required by the accepting jurisdiction.

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15 (ii) The contractor shall provide proof of

16 the successful completion of the international code council

17 examination for contractor, plumbing, mechanical or another

18 appropriate examination, or an equivalent. Contractors

19 seeking to have a license recognized by an accepting

20 jurisdiction for fire systems installation, testing or

21 maintenance shall provide proof of the successful

22 completion of the appropriate manufacturer certification,

23 including the national institute for certification in

1 engineering technologies, American fire sprinkler 2 association, national fire sprinkler association or their 3 equivalents. Upon providing appropriate proof under this 4 paragraph, no contractor shall be required to complete any testing in the accepting jurisdiction for recognition of 5 the license; 6 7 8 (iii) Any applications required for recognition of a license by an accepting jurisdiction shall only 9 10 require the minimum amount of information necessary for the 11 accepting jurisdiction to verify the license and the 12 contractor's good standing in the issuing jurisdiction; 13 14 (iv) The accepting jurisdiction may require a contractor to provide proof sufficient for the accepting 15 16 jurisdiction to confirm that the contractor's license is 17 active and in good standing in the issuing jurisdiction; 18 19 (v)The accepting jurisdiction may 20 contractor recognition of a license if the contractor has 21 previously had a license revoked or suspended by the accepting jurisdiction; 22

1 (vi) Nothing in this subsection shall be 2 construed to: 3 4 (A) Require an accepting jurisdiction to grant privileges to a contractor for a license that is not 5 of a similar type or class to the license granted by the 6 7 issuing jurisdiction; 8 9 (B) Prohibit an accepting jurisdiction from 10 requiring a contractor to complete application requirements 11 procedures, satisfactorily complete and any 12 requirements or pay fees if the contractor seeks to perform 13 work in an accepting jurisdiction that is not covered under the license issued by the issuing jurisdiction or seeks to 14 15 perform work that is not at an equivalent level of required 16 competency in the accepting jurisdiction. 17 18 (c) Nothing in this subsection shall be construed to 19 prohibit any county, city, town or other government entity 20 that issues licenses to contractors from entering into 21 agreements for the recognition of licenses obtained in

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other jurisdictions in Wyoming.

Section 2. This act is effective July 1, 2024.
