Source of revenue increase:

This bill increases the non-resident daily, five-day, and annual fishing license fees from \$12 to \$14, \$54 to \$60, and \$100 to \$110, respectively.

Assumptions:

Assuming the number of non-resident fishing licenses issued are consistent with the five-year average for calendar years 2018 through 2022, an annual total revenue increase of \$672,696 is anticipated for the Game and Fish Fund.

The calendar year 2018 through 2022 average number of non-resident fishing licenses issued were as follows:

- Non-resident daily: 163,217 licenses x \$2 increase = \$326,434 annual revenue increase
- Non-resident five-day: 22,317 licenses x \$6 increase = \$133,902 annual revenue increase
- Non-resident annual: 21,236 licenses x \$10 increase = \$212,360 annual revenue increase
