Description of appropriation:

This bill requires the Division of Criminal Investigation (DCI) to establish the forensic genetic genealogy pilot program. In administering the program, DCI may use funds to conduct forensic genetic genealogical DNA analyses in its investigations or provide grants to local law enforcement agencies to conduct forensic genetic genealogical DNA analyses in investigations, pursuant to rules promulgated by DCI. Any unobligated, unexpended funds appropriated in the bill revert to the GENERAL FUND on June 30, 2029.

The Attorney General's Office indicated that the funding will be used to pay for genetic genealogy services in DCI investigative cases, when applicable, and will also be made available to local agencies through a grant application process, which will be created by DCI. Criteria will be established for the grant application to determine eligibility for the use of the funds. If approved, funds will be used to reimburse costs to local agencies for genetic genealogy services to generate leads in investigative cases and/or unidentified human remains investigations.

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
