Description of appropriation:

As of July 1, 2024, this legislation increases the employee contribution to the Judicial Pension Plan by 2.25 percent and increases the required employee out-of-pocket contribution by 0.35 percent. Hence, employers may pay 1.9 percent of the increase and employees must pay 0.35 percent of the increase. The 1.9 percent increase which may be paid by employers is estimated at \$194,000 per year, rounded.

The entire 2.25 percent increase is estimated at \$230,000 per year, rounded. The 1.9 percent increase which may be paid by employers is estimated at \$194,000 per year, rounded. The increase of the 0.35 percent required employee out-of-pocket contribution is estimated at \$36,000 per year, rounded.

Source of expenditure increase:

The Judicial Branch will have an estimated increase in expenditures of \$194,000 each year for the employer portion of the increase in retirement contributions. The expenditure increase for FY 2025 and FY 2026 will come from the appropriation in the bill.

Assumptions:

The employer pays 1.9 percent of the 2.25 percent increase.

The standard budget for the 2025-2026 biennium for salaries for justices and judges is approximately \$10.1 million per year.
