## A BILL

for

9 Section 1.

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- 11 (a) The mental health and vulnerable adult task force
- 12 created by management council in 2023 is hereby continued.

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13 The task force shall consist of the following members:

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2 (vi) Not later than October 1, 2024, report to

3 the governor, management council and any applicable

4 committee of the legislature on the work of the task force,

5 including any recommendations for legislation for

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8 (c) The task force shall be staffed by the

9 legislative service office.

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11 (d) The legislative members of the task force shall

12 receive salary, per diem and travel expenses in the manner

13 and amount prescribed by W.S. 28-5-101. Task force members

14 who are government employees or officials shall be

15 considered to be acting within the scope of regular

16 employment when conducting the official business of the

17 task force and shall receive their regular pay without

18 additional compensation, except that those members shall

19 receive mileage and per diem as provided for other members

20 of the task force under this subsection if they are not

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21 reimbursed by their employer.

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1 (e) The task force shall terminate on December 31,

2 2024.

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4 Section 2. There is appropriated fifty-five thousand 5 dollars (\$55,000.00) from the general fund to the legislative service office for purposes of providing 6 salary, mileage and per diem to the legislative members of 7 8 the mental health and vulnerable adult task force appointed under section 1(a)(i) of this act and for per diem and 9 mileage, if necessary, for members of the task force 10 serving under section 1(a)(ii) of this act. 11 This appropriation shall be for the period beginning with the 12 effective date of this act and ending June 30, 2025. This 13 appropriation shall not be transferred or expended for any 14 and any unexpended, unobligated funds 15 other purpose 16 remaining from this appropriation shall revert as provided

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by law on June 30, 2025.

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1 Section 3. This act is effective immediately upon completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law 2 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming 3 4 Constitution. 5
