6 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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- 8 **Section 1.** W.S. 15-1-133 and 18-2-117 are created to

14 (a) As used in this section:

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2 (i) "Federal officials" or "federal law 3 enforcement officers" means any person employed by the 4 United States government for the purpose of enforcing or regulating federal immigration laws and any peace officer 5 as defined in W.S. 7-2-101(a)(iv) when the person or peace 6 officer is acting within the scope of their employment for 7 8 the purpose of enforcing federal immigration laws 9 preserving homeland security;

11 (ii) "Immigration status" means the legality or
12 illegality of a person's presence in the United States as
13 determined by federal law;

14

(iii) "Immigration status information" means any 15 16 information that is not confidential or privileged by law 17 including any statement, document, computer generated data, 18 recording or photograph that is relevant to immigration 19 status or the identity or location of a person who is 20 reasonably believed to be illegally residing within the United States or who is involved in international terrorism 21 or domestic terrorism as defined in 18 U.S.C. § 2331; 22

6 (v) "Policy" means any regulation, rule,

7 ordinance, policy or practice adopted by the governing body

10 (b) No governing body of a city or town, whether
11 acting through its governing body or by an initiative,
12 referendum or any other process, shall enact, adopt,

13 implement or enforce any policy that prohibits or restricts

14 local officials or employees from communicating or

15 cooperating with federal officials or law enforcement

16 officers with regard to reporting immigration status

17 information while the local official or employee is acting

18 within the scope of his official duties.

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20 (c) Upon a determination by the governor, with advice 21 from the attorney general, that a governing body of a city 22 or town has violated subsection (b) of this section, the 23 governor shall require the office of state lands and

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- 1 investments and the department of revenue to withhold all
- 2 state and state administered federal funding directly paid
- 3 to the city or town, unless otherwise specifically provided

4 by law.

10 status or the identity or location of a person who is

11 reasonably believed to be illegally residing within the

12 United States or involved in international terrorism or

13 domestic terrorism as defined in 18 U.S.C. § 2331;

15 (v) "Policy" means any regulation, rule,

16 resolution, policy or practice adopted by the governing

17 body of a county.

18

19 (b) No board of county commissioners, whether acting

20 through its governing body or by an initiative, referendum

21 or any other process, shall enact, adopt, implement or

22 enforce any policy that prohibits or restricts county

23 officials or employees from communicating or cooperating

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1 with federal officials or law enforcement officers with

2 regard to reporting immigration status information while

3 the local official or employee is acting within the scope

4 of their official duties.

5

6 (c) Upon a determination by the governor, with advice

7 from the attorney general, that a board of county

8 commissioners has violated subsection (b) of this section,

9 the governor shall require the office of state lands and

10 investments and the department of revenue to withhold all

11 state and state administered federal funding, unless

12 otherwise specifically provided by law.

13

14 **Section 2**. This act is effective immediately upon

15 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law

16 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming

17 Constitution.
