A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to gaming; specifying persons involved in 2 horse racing and pari-mutuel wagering activities who shall 3 be subject to criminal background checks; specifying 4 rulemaking requirements for the Wyoming gaming commission; 5 providing definitions; and providing for an effective date. 6 7 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming: 8 9 Section 1. W.S. 11-25-104(e) and (f) is amended to 10 read: 11 12 11-25-104. Gaming commission; officers; director; 13 meetings; quorum; records; licenses generally; effect of 14 financial interest in events. 15

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1 (e) The commission may authorize by license or permit 2 and supervise all the conduct of all events provided for 3 regulated by this act. The commission may make and 4 reasonable rules for the control, supervision and direction of applicants, permittees and licensees. The rules shall 5 include procedures for resolving scheduling conflicts and 6 settling disputes between permittees, for the supervising, 7 8 disciplining, suspending, fining and barring from pari-mutuel events of all persons required to be licensed 9 10 or permitted by this act, and for the holding, conducting 11 and operating of all pari-mutuel events pursuant to this 12 act. The rules shall include requirements for internal controls for all aspects of pari-mutuel wagering, including 13 14 procedures for system integrity, system security, 15 operations and accounting. The commission may require that 16 license applicants be fingerprinted for identification 17 purposes as a condition of licensing. The commission shall announce the place, time and duration of pari-mutuel events 18 19 for which license or permit fees shall be required and 20 establish reasonable fees for all licenses and permits 21 provided for by this act. The fees shall be established to 22 ensure that the costs of administering this act are 23 recovered through the total revenues received under this

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1 commission shall establish security access act. The 2 safeguards for licensees to use for advance deposit 3 pari-mutuel wagering. The commission shall prohibit advance 4 deposit pari-mutuel advertising that it determines to be 5 deceptive to the public.

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7 (f) Each permittee, participant and licensee, any 8 current and prospective employee, volunteer and contract employee of a permittee or participant who is directly 9 10 involved in the licensee and each person who has access to restricted areas or animals housed on permitted event 11 grounds for horse racing or for pari-mutuel wagering 12 activities of the permittee or participant, as defined in 13 commission rule and regulation, shall be licensed by the 14 commission and shall comply with all rules and regulations 15 16 and all orders issued by the commission. No person shall 17 hold any event with pari-mutuel wagering without obtaining 18 a permit. The commission shall require that all permittees, 19 licensees, current and prospective employees, volunteers 20 and contract employees of a permittee or licensee and each 21 person who has access to restricted areas or animals housed 22 on permitted event grounds for horse racing or for pari-mutuel activities submit fingerprints to the Wyoming 23

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1	division of criminal investigation to perform a criminal
2	history background check pursuant to W.S. 7-19-201 in order
3	to obtain state and national criminal history record
4	information. The division may share the results of the
5	criminal history background check with the commission
6	pursuant to W.S. 7-19-106(a)(xxxv). For purposes of this
7	subsection, permittees, licensees, current and prospective
8	employees, volunteers and contract employees of a permittee
9	or licensee, shall include the following as defined:
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11	(i) "Assistant starter" means a person who
12	handles a horse in the starting gate on race day and during
13	training;
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15	(ii) "Assistant trainer" means a person who is
16	designated by the trainer to make decisions on behalf of
17	the trainer during the trainer's absence;
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19	(iii) "Clerk of scales" means a person whose
20	primary responsibility is to weigh the riders before and
21	after a race to ensure proper weight is carried;
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1	(iv) "Commission or permittee employee" means a
2	person who is an employee that by virtue of their required
3	duties has access to restricted areas of the permitted
4	event grounds or has access to information that is limited
5	by law or confidential in nature and could effectuate or
6	manipulate wagering activity or wagering information;
7	
8	(v) "Commission safety officer" means a person
9	who is employed by the commission to monitor activities and
10	practices in the stable area, barn area and on the
11	racetrack for compliance with this act and rules of the
12	<pre>commission;</pre>
13	
14	(vi) "Commission veterinarian" means a Wyoming
15	licensed veterinarian hired directly by the commission;
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17	(vii) "Exercise rider" means a person who
18	exercises a horse during a training session;
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20	(viii) "Farrier" means a person who provides
21	hoof care, including the trimming and balancing of horses
22	hooves and placing of shoes on hooves, if necessary;
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1	(ix) "Groom" means a person who cleans stalls,
2	bathes, brushes and provides general care to a race horse;
3	
4	(x) "Horseman's bookkeeper" means a person whose
5	primary responsibility is to keep and preserve books which
6	will reflect the deposits or other credits and withdrawals
7	or other charges that may be made by an owner or other
8	licensee;
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10	(xi) "Host facility" means a person who leases
11	their property to a permitholder to operate or host
12	pari-mutuel wagering;
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14	(xii) "Identifier" means a person who verifies
15	the identity of each race horse prior to the race;
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17	(xiii) "Jockey" means a person who is a race
18	rider of a horse, including a licensed jockey or an
19	apprentice jockey;
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21	(xiv) "Jockey agent" means a person who handles
22	the daily business of a jockey or apprentice;
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1	(xv) "Mutuel employee" means a person who acts
2	under the direction of the mutuel managers and sells
3	betting tickets;
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5	(xvi) "Mutuel manager" means a person who is an
б	employee of the permittee who manages the mutuel department
7	overseeing all wagering activity;
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9	(xvii) "Owner" means a person who is the owner,
10	part owner or lessee of a horse;
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12	(xviii) "Paddock judge" means a person who is
13	responsible for the paddock area and saddling routine of
14	the race horses;
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16	(xix) "Pari-mutuel service provider" means any
17	business or person providing goods or services to a
18	pari-mutuel permitholder who is required to have access to
19	designated and secured areas of the pari-mutuel event or
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∠∪	provides direct services for the support of players or
21	wagering terminals;
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1	(xx) "Patrol judge" means a person who observes
2	the progress of a race from various vantage points around
3	the track;
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5	(xxi) "Permitholder" means a person or entity
6	holding a permit issued by the Wyoming gaming commission to
7	operate a pari-mutuel facility;
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9	(xxii) "Permittee official" means any mutuel
10	manager, steward, events judge, placing judge, patrol
11	judge, paddock judge, clerk of scale, identifier, starter,
12	horsemen bookkeeper, track safety officer, racing secretary
13	and track superintendent who by virtue of their position
14	has unrestricted access to the pari-mutuel event grounds
15	and animals participating;
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17	(xxiii) "Placing judge" means a person who posts
18	the order of finish in a race;
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20	(xxiv) "Pony rider" means a person that rides a
21	horse while leading another race horse, either during a
22	training session or escorting the race horse to the post on
23	race days;

1 (xxv) "Private practice veterinarian" means a 2 3 Wyoming licensed veterinarian hired to provide services to 4 owners and trainers; 5 б (xxvi) "Racing secretary" means a person who 7 drafts conditions of races and assigns weights for handicap 8 events; 9 10 (xxvii) "Rodeo contestant" means a person who is 11 a contestant in a pari-mutuel rodeo event licensed by the 12 commission; 13 14 (xxviii) "Rodeo stock contractor" means a person who provides livestock for the pari-mutuel rodeo event; 15 16 17 (xxix) "Security employee" means a person who is 18 responsible for the protection of property, people, acting 19 in accordance with the permittee's guidelines; 20 21 (xxx) "Service provider employee" means a person 22 who is an employee of the pari-mutuel service providers who provide additional support to the vendor; 23

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2	(xxxi) "Starter" means a person who is
3	responsible for the official dispatching of horses for a
4	race;
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6	(xxxii) "Steward or event judge" means a person
7	who is the head event official, or their designee, charged
8	with the duty of making sure the events comply with this
9	act and the rules of the commission;
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11	(xxxiii) "Track safety officer" means a person
12	who monitors the paddock and racetrack areas during all
13	training and racing hours for safety related issues;
14	
15	(xxxiv) "Track superintendent" means a person
16	who is responsible for all track maintenance, ensuring that
17	the track surface is properly groomed and prepared for
18	training and racing hours;
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20	(xxxv) "Trainer" means a person who is engaged
21	in the training of race horses;
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1 (xxxvi) "Valet" means a person who assists in the saddling of horses for the jockeys in a pari-mutuel 2 3 event; 4 5 (xxxvii) "Veterinarian assistant" means a person who is hired by a commission veterinarian or a private 6 practice veterinarian to assist in providing veterinarian 7 8 services under the direct supervision of a licensed 9 veterinarian. 10 11 Section 2. This act is effective immediately upon 12 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law 13 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming Constitution. 14 15
