A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to eminent domain; limiting the exercise of

2 the power of condemnation for energy collector systems;

3 providing compensation standards for condemned property as

4 specified; requiring proof of compliance; providing

5 definitions; making conforming amendments; repealing an

6 existing provision; specifying applicability; and providing

7 for an effective date.

9 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

11 **Section 1.** W.S. 1-26-715 and 1-26-818 are created to

12 read:

14 1-26-715. Compensation for condemnation of property

15 for energy collector systems.

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2 Compensation related to the condemnation of property for

3 the erection, placement or expansion of a collector system

4 associated with a commercial facility generating

5 electricity shall be made in accordance with W.S. 1-26-818.

7 1-26-818. Right of eminent domain granted; energy

8 collector systems.

10 (a) No person, except those persons specified in

11 subsection (f) of this section, shall exercise the

12 authority granted by W.S. 1-26-815 to condemn property for

13 the erection, placement or expansion of a collector system

14 associated with a commercial facility generating

15 electricity without complying with this section.

16

17 (b) Before any person to whom subsection (a) of this

18 section applies may exercise the power of eminent domain,

19 the person shall:

21 (i) Negotiate and have finalized land use and

2

22 compensation agreements:

1	(A) Which shall grant the person the right
2	to occupy and use not less than eighty-five percent (85%)
3	of the land upon which the collector system will be
4	constructed; or
5	
6	(B) With not less than eighty-five percent
7	(85%) of the owners of the land upon which the collector
8	system will be constructed if there are more than two (2)
9	landowners involved in the potential condemnation action.
10	
11	(ii) Allege in any complaint for condemnation
12	and provide proof to a court of competent jurisdiction
13	compliance with paragraph (i) of this subsection;
14	
15	(iii) Allege in any complaint for condemnation
16	and provide proof to a court of competent jurisdiction all
17	terms and consideration, monetary and otherwise, granted to
18	the owners of property with whom the person negotiated
19	under paragraph (i) of this subsection; and
20	
21	(iv) Allege in any complaint for condemnation
22	and provide proof to a court of competent jurisdiction that

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the commercial facility generating electricity with which

- 1 the collector system is associated constitutes an
- 2 economically, legally and logistically viable project.

- 4 (c) In any condemnation allowed under this section,
- 5 the person whose land is condemned shall be compensated
- 6 with consideration that is equivalent to the average
- 7 consideration including terms and conditions given to the
- 8 other owners of the land upon which the collector system
- 9 will be constructed or, if the collector system will be
- 10 constructed on the land of two (2) or less landowners, that
- 11 is equivalent to the fair market value of the land that is
- 12 to be condemned and that includes comparable terms
- 13 including terms and conditions paid to the owners of land
- 14 with whom the condemnor negotiated under paragraph (b)(i)
- 15 of this section if applicable.

16

- 17 (d) W.S. 1-26-701 through 1-26-715 shall apply to any
- 18 condemnation under this section except to the extent the
- 19 restrictions in this section are inconsistent with those
- 20 statutes.

- 22 (e) Unless specified in an existing easement or the
- 23 infrastructure is already existing, a commercial facility

- 1 generating electricity shall not use an existing easement
- 2 to place additional collector systems associated with a
- 3 commercial facility generating electricity without first
- 4 complying with this section.

6 (f) This section shall not apply to:

- 8 (i) A public utility that has been granted a
- 9 certificate of public convenience and necessity pursuant to
- 10 W.S. 37-2-205; or

- 12 (ii) Electric substations or interconnection
- 13 facilities associated with existing or proposed
- 14 transmission lines that serve load or that export energy
- 15 from Wyoming.

- 21 conductor infrastructure, including conductors, towers,
- 22 substations, switchgear and other components necessary to
- 23 deliver power from any commercial facility generating
