



Wyoming Department of Transportation Revenue Information System

Background

The Revenue Information System (RIS) is used by the State of Wyoming to provide services to our citizens related to driver licenses, driving records and vehicle registration. The system was developed in the 1980s using COBOL technology and resides on the Enterprise Technology Services (ETS) mainframe. Though currently fairly stable, the system's antiquated technology limits the ability to find expertise to continue to maintain it.

RIS is accessed by over 30 third-party entities ranging from the National Law Enforcement Telecommunication System (NLETS) for all law enforcement entities, all 23 Wyoming County Clerks and Treasurers offices, as well as several federal agencies and contract vendors. These entities rely on the security, efficiency, and dependability of the system. (See attachment.)

Presentation

As discussed in previous committee meetings, the system needs to be modernized or replaced. WYDOT has worked with others, including ETS, to assemble a stakeholder group to discuss system needs. To successfully manage a system modernization/replacement project, WYDOT has engaged a consultant to develop a more comprehensive cost estimate and assist with the development of a strong project management plan.
