11 Except as specified under subsection (b) of this (a) 12 section, this article shall not be construed to prohibit the imposition by local law or ordinance of further 13 regulation or prohibition upon the sale, use and possession 14 of tobacco nicotine products to any person under eighteen 15 16 (18) nineteen (19) years of age, but the governmental 17 entity shall not permit or authorize the sale, use or possession of tobacco nicotine products to any person under 18 19 eighteen (18) nineteen (19) years of age in violation of 20 this article.

22 (c) The governmental entity may require that sellers
23 of tobacco nicotine products obtain a license to sell

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1 tobacco <u>nicotine</u> products and may deny or revoke the

license in the case of reported violations of W.S. 14-3-302 2

3 or similar local ordinance.
