6 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

- 8 **Section 1**. W.S. 37-2-101(a) through (e) and 37-2-102
- 9 are amended to read:

1 37-2-101. Creation; composition; appointment; 2 compensation; terms and oaths of members; removal; chairman 3 and deputy chairman; vacancies. 4 There is created a commission separate from the 5 (a) state board of equalization to which it has been joined 6 which is known as the "public service commission of 7 8 Wyoming". The commission shall consist of five (5) members, 9 three (3) members appointed by the governor, by and with 10 the advice and consent of the senate, one (1) member of the 11 house of representatives appointed by the speaker of the 12 house and one (1) member of the senate appointed by the president of the senate. Not more than seventy-five percent 13 (75%) of the members of the commission shall at any time be 14 15 members of the same political party. Each member of the 16 commission appointed by the governor shall receive an 17 annual salary as provided by law, to be paid in equal monthly installments in the same manner that other state 18 19 salaries are paid. 20 21 (b) Biennially the members shall elect from among their number—the members appointed by the governor a 22

chairman and a deputy chairman who shall serve in these

1 offices for a period of two (2) years. The chairman shall

2 receive an additional annual salary as provided by law

3 during his tenure as chairman to be paid in equal monthly

4 installments, in the same manner as other state salaries

5 are paid.

7 (c) The present elected chairman and two (2)

8 designated members now comprising the public service

9 commission, or their successors, and two (2) legislative

10 members appointed under subsection (a) of this section

11 comprise the public service commission for purposes of this

14 (d) Upon the expiration of the term of any member

15 appointed by the governor he shall be reappointed or a

16 successor shall be appointed for a term of six (6) years or

17 except in case of a vacancy. Each member appointed by the

18 governor shall hold office until his successor is appointed

19 and qualified. The governor may remove any member he

appoints as provided in W.S. 9-1-202. Each legislative

21 member shall hold office until the expiration of the

22 legislator's term of office or until removed by the

23 <u>legislative presiding officer who appointed him. Upon the</u>

1	expiration of the term of any legislative member of the
2	commission, he shall be reappointed or a successor shall be
3	appointed as provided in subsection (a) of this section.

5	(e) In case of a vacancy of a member appointed by the
6	governor, it shall be filled by appointment by the governor

• The definition of "commissioner" is amended here to include only the members that the governor appoints to preclude legislators from holding commission hearings on their own. See W.S. 37-2-102.

- There is currently no provision in the bill that would cover compensation for the legislative members.
- Per current statute (W.S. 37-2-111), the Attorney General is the Commission's legal adviser. Inserting legislative members onto the Commission would implicate this section in terms of separation of powers.
- The Committee may wish to consider the mechanics of initially appointing legislators to the Commission (see Section 2 below).
