## A BILL

AN ACT relating to the provider recruitment grant program;
repealing the health care provider recruitment grant
program; reverting funds from the Wyoming provider
recruitment account; making conforming amendments; and
providing for an effective date.
Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:
<b>Section 1.</b> W.S. 9-2-117(a)(iii)(intro) is amended to
read:
9-2-117. Office of rural health created; duties.

1 The office of rural health is created within the (a) department of health. The office shall: 2 3 4 (iii) Contract, if necessary, with other entities to carry out duties prescribed under this section, 5 6 and to conduct an active and ongoing recruitment program 7 for physicians and other health care professionals, subject 8 to the availability of funds, and to engage in the 9 following activities: 10 11 Section 2. W.S. 35-1-240(a)(xxii) and 35-1-1101 are 12 repealed. 13 14 STAFF COMMENT 15 The following italicized language would be repealed by section 2 of this act: 16 17 35-1-240. Powers and duties. 18 (a) The department of health, through the state health officer, or under his direction and supervision, through the other employees of the department, shall have and 19 20 exercise the following powers and duties: (xxii) Administer the Wyoming physician recruitment grant program 21 22 *provided in W.S. 35-1-1101;* 23 24 35-1-1101. Provider recruitment grant program. 25 (a) There is created the Wyoming provider recruitment program administered by the department. 26 27 (b) There is created the Wyoming provider recruitment account. Funds in the account are continuously appropriated to the department to provide grants for provider 28 recruitment. Up to ten percent (10%) of the funds may be used to advertise the provider 29 30 recruitment program. 31 (c) The department shall solicit provider recruitment applications from hospitals, physicians and others seeking to recruit providers. The applications shall be prioritized 32 33 by need based on geographic area, then by medical need within the geographic area.

1 Priority shall be given to recruitment of private practice providers. The department shall 2 issue award letters to the persons or entities receiving grant authorizations within sixty (60) days after the close of an application period. The grant authorizations shall 3 4 authorize the person or entity receiving it, for a period of one (1) year, to make a firm 5 offer of recruitment incorporating the benefits authorized by this section to a candidate, 6 conditioned upon Wyoming licensure and the candidate's signed written agreement to the 7 conditions of this section. 8 (d) The department shall promulgate rules and regulations to administer the 9 program, including provisions for: 10 *(i) Application forms for grants under the program;* 11 (ii) Termination of grants and full or partial repayment if a provider fails 12 to comply with the conditions of this section, rules and regulations of the department 13 adopted pursuant to this section or the terms of the written incentive agreement; 14 (iii) Reporting requirements for grant recipients. 15 (e) Grants provided under this section shall be subject to the following: 16 *(i) The provider shall be recruited to a stipulated geographic area;* 17 (ii) A provider shall relocate his practice to the state of Wyoming from 18 outside of the state to be eligible for a grant. Providers relocating to the state of 19 Wyoming to become employed by the state or by the United States shall not be eligible for 20 grants. The requirement to relocate pursuant to this paragraph shall not apply to 21 providers recruited from a family practice residency in the state or recruitment of 22 providers employed by the United States department of defense; 23 (iii) The recruitment conditions between a hospital and a physician shall 24 meet the conditions set forth in 42 C.F.R. 411.357(e), as amended; 25 (iv) Recruitment of new providers shall be based on demonstrable need. 26 Those recruiting persons or entities demonstrating the greatest need, in the discretion of 27 the department shall be given the highest priority in receiving grants pursuant to this 28 section; 29 (v) All recruitment incentives shall be in writing and shall be reported on 30 federal income tax forms; 31 (vi) The recruited provider shall agree to provide medical services in the 32 community to which he was recruited for a period of not less than two (2) years or the 33 recruiting entity shall repay any monies granted under subparagraphs (e)(viii)(B)34 through (D) of this section to the state of Wyoming plus interest at the rate of ten percent 35 (10%) per annum; 36 (vii) The recruited provider shall agree to provide medical care for not 37 less than two (2) years in underserved areas of the state and shall accept patients qualified under the Medical Assistance and Services Act, Title XVIII of the federal Social 38 39 Security Act and the child health insurance program who seek medical care which the 40 health care provider is qualified to provide or the recruiting entity shall repay any 41 monies granted under this section to the state of Wyoming plus interest at the rate of ten 42 percent (10%) per annum; 43 (viii) Costs reimbursed through grants under the program shall be 44 documented by the provider as required by the department and may include:
